YOUTH DESIGN CHALLENGE

Do you like computer games, new tech or performance and art design?
Or are you a budding journalist?
Do you want to see changes in your community and in the world?
Are you aged 14+?

We're looking for young designers and reporters to help us develop a unique new venue in the centre of Bristol, the Global Goals Centre (GGC)!

With your help we want to create the world's first visitor experience offering interactive challenges, games and ideas on today's vital issues such as climate change, health, single-use plastics and human rights, to tell people about these Goals and find out how they can help us reach them! We know you will come up with incredible, exciting and brilliant ideas, and we are going to support you with expert mentors - artists, designers and scientists - so that your ideas can really fly! The best designs and young designers will be used to help inspire and perhaps even build the project - brilliant experience on a real world project. **This will be your Centre!**

The best ideas will be taken forward by our team, and you might have the opportunity to work with us on the design of the Centre and see your idea come to life! Have a look at our website first and then choose a Challenge.

Do you ever think about the changes you would like to make to the world to make it a better place? Just an impossible dream? We actually have a world plan to make it possible!

All 193 countries have committed to 17 Global Goals to end poverty, inequality and climate chaos by 2030.

CHALLENGE 1: BECOME ONE OF OUR DESIGNERS

STEP 1

The Global Goals Centre is planning a number of interactive spaces to enable people to engage with these Goals in a fun, revelatory, enlightening and inspiring way, to help them explore the links between their own lives and people, places and issues throughout the world. And you can help us design these!

STEP 2

Choose one of the UN Global Goals or a related issue to focus on. If you have never heard of them, have a read. There are 17 of them! It might be Climate Action or Gender Equality for example.

Why is this issue important to you? How does it also connect with other goals and how might that influence your design? For example, in some countries girls do not have the same opportunities to go to school; this links Goal 4 - Quality Education, and Goal 5 - Gender Equality.

STEP 3

Identify what you want your audience to do during a visit to your part of the experience - will they just read or watch something, or actively participate? And tell us what key things do you want them to take away from the experience - what do you want them to do differently after their visit to help change life for the better?

How are you going to create something truly memorable that motivates them to change their thinking and their behaviour?

STEP 4

Design the space! What display technology would you use, augmented reality or projection mapping for example? Might it involve a game or role playing? How playful might it be? Is it more like an escape room or cinema or theatre experience? Assume that the group size in your room is 10 and your part of the experience will last for about 15 minutes.

How would your experiences start and end?

Submit your idea as a portfolio of material which could include a set of images with description (up to 6), a short film or audio (no longer than 3 mins) by 30th June 2020, making sure you answer the questions in Step 3.

CHALLENGE 2: BECOME ONE OF OUR REPORTERS

YOUR MISSION

If you enjoy writing or film making and want to become a journalist or researcher then this challenge is for you! Although we are living through very difficult and challenging times, there are some great examples of people and communities responding in positive ways.

Find out what is going on out there and tell us about them, either as a news story or a video, so we can promote the great initiatives that inspire and support you and your community.

STEP 1

Register your involvement by emailing manu@globalgoalscentre.org.

We can link you with an expert mentor who can help you develop your idea.

STEP 2

Find a local project that inspires you. It might be one you have been involved with, for example, a street WhatsApp group to help neighbours support each other, or a local food growing project. Or it might be in another town or even country that you've read about that you think we should try in our city.

It could even be something that you, a friend or family member has been doing!

STEP 3

Tell us about the project you have chosen, and why it inspires you. Identify how the project you select fits with the UN Global Goals. If you haven't heard of them, have a read. There are 17 of them! Your project will probably fit with more than one Goal as they all link together - include all that are relevant. Perhaps you can interview those running it or benefitting from it. Add in any images or social media and website links to the project to help readers understand and follow up. What support does the project need? How can your readers get involved?

STEP 4

Submit your report or film by **31st August 2020**.

Your report should be no more than 2 pages of A4, including images. In addition, you could make a short video or audio piece about the project (less than 2 mins).

BONUS: The best ideas will receive an Award from Bristol's Mayor, Marvin Rees.
